Class News:

Nursery: Blossom class had lots of fun colour mixing, exploring, splashing, splatting and brushing! The children used all of their muscles to brush with the big brushes and smaller brushes. They even tried using branches from the trees and bushes! We also came across a problem because the shower curtain didn't hold the paint. "Oh! Where's it gone?!" one child asked! Luckily Miss Shepherd came to the rescue with a plain white sheet and the children were very excited to splatter the paint onto it, brush marks and we even had a few hand prints!

Reception: This term, we have been learning our Little Wandle phonics and are starting to write simple words. In Maths we are solving practical problems with numbers up to 5.

We are still learning how to be a good friend and have enjoyed some lovely stories especially about Isaac the hedgehog who needed to find a warm cosy home.

Year 1: Willow class have been enjoying exploring our school grounds using aerial photos to identify the different areas. They then produced their own maps of school with a key. We have also had a great time testing our sense of taste and smell.

Year 2: Ash Class have had a very busy month! One of the main highlights was our trip to Grosvenor Estate to spend time with the grounds keepers and their team! We took part in pond dipping, hedgerow walks, worm digging and nature hunts. We learnt so much and asked A LOT of questions! Year 2 have really enjoyed their Science unit on animals and their habitats this half term! Forest School has been another highlight that has supported our learning about animals and their habitats.

Year 3: Hazel Class have enjoyed reading week this month...we have read in all sorts of strange places, read to the Nursery children and also enjoyed making a 'Book in a Jar' during our Family Member to School afternoon. We also enjoyed watching the Tempest production by the Storyhouse...what a treat!

Year 4: This month, Birch class have enjoyed our History sessions with Jess from Storyhouse. We have enjoyed learning about Chester and the historical landmarks in the city. We have also had our first art days of the year and enjoyed making bookmarks using our sewing skills. In Maths, the children have been trying really hard to learn the times tables up to 12x12.

Year 5: The children in Holly Class have ended this half term very well. We have completed our diary entries in the role of Annie Edson Taylor - the heroine of Niagara falls - and the children have really enjoyed learning all about her incredible feat. Also, we have further expanded our knowledge of multiplication looking at multiples, factors, common factors and much more! Lastly, the children produced some fantastic artwork in the style of French artist Claude Monet. Well done year 5!

Year 6: Oak Class thoroughly enjoyed their trip to the Military Museum and learnt so much through the various workshops including how to deal with an incendiary bomb (in the form of a potato)! Carrying on with our History theme, we spent a day cooking a meal using rations. We have some budding chefs and restaurant critics in Year 6 and everyone was able to suggest ways to improve our meal which links with our design and technology evaluating strand.

Eden: Eden enjoyed our Family Member to School event early in the month where each group engaged in different activities. Our Seedling and Little Acorn children enjoyed a stay and play session with their parents and then all were involved in a Bucket Therapy session. Mini and Mighty Oaks used the book 'Silly Billy' By Anthony Browne to create their own worry dolls. We shared our Zones of Regulation with parents and showed them how we check in throughout the day. To end the half term, Mini and Mighty Oaks enjoyed their local area visit to Upton Library and park and the morning was finished off nicely with some yummy treats at Cafe Number One.
