They have also helped to plant some lovely plants in our garden and look after them each day, watering them when needed.

Reception: We have had a fun half term in Apple Class making traps for the evil pea and wearing our superhero capes. We have been thinking about real life superheroes too; we've been making police motor bikes with the crates and writing up reports in the police station, keeping Apple Class in order!! We enjoyed having our family visit and making superhero healthy kebabs.



Year 1: Willow Class have worked incredibly hard in Maths to learn all about multiplication. It has been tricky at times but they all gave it their all. We have also enjoyed learning all about the UK, its countries, capitals and surrounding seas.

Year 2: March has been another very busy month in Year 2! We have really enjoyed exploring our book -Major Glad Major Dizzy in English and have been building up to our final diary entry piece at the end of the unit. We have really enjoyed the history we can see in the book and have found it very interesting to see the changes since the Victorian times. We have had A LOT of questions throughout this unit © The children have also loved working with Elenka from the Storyhouse in our sessions looking at the Great Fire of London! The children have re-enacted the events, learnt songs and dances and learnt so many facts about the fire.

Year 3: This month, Hazel Class have thoroughly enjoyed our Chester Zoo workshops. We have been monitoring animals with identification apps and binoculars, discussing native and non-native species as well as looking after the habitats by doing some litter picking. We also thoroughly enjoyed World Book Day where we read books to our Nursery children and completed some WBD crafts.

Year 4: In March, Birch Class have enjoyed learning about their volcanoes topic in Geography. They all really enjoyed learning about Pompeii last half term and have enjoyed furthering their understandings throughout this topic. The children have all had lots of fun during our workshops with Chester Zoo this month where they have learnt about animals in the UK and their habitats as well as how we can help protect them and we are all really looking forward to our upcoming trip to the zoo.

Year 5: Holly Class have been so busy this month!

We managed to complete our mobiles in art where we took inspiration from Alexander Calder. The children really enjoyed this activity and created some fantastic mobiles.

In English, we have continued our learning about Canadian Astronaut Chris Hadfield and have started writing our biography on him.

Lastly, the children have thoroughly enjoyed their Forest School sessions where we have been looking for mini beasts, building shelters and much more.

Year 6: Oak Class have had a busy half term. We have thoroughly enjoyed all our Zoo workshops with Alex and Phil from Chester Zoo which has tied in well with our Science topic of evolution and adaptation. We cannot wait for our trip to the zoo in the final week of term!

World Book Day was great fun with some great outfits and book sharing - our class had such a lovely time listening to the year 2 children read and reading to them.

Eden: We enjoyed our Parent to School event where we used a gorgeous book called 'The Extraordinary Gardener.' The book follows themes of imagination, colour and nature and this encouraged the children to share their own experiences. We created our own art work and planted seeds to create our own 'cress heads'. The children then created their own 'Extraordinary garden' sign. They enjoyed sharing stories of their 'Garden of Eden' project with Mr Ellinson in Forest School and they were so pleased to know they had raised money for school funds. What an achievement! Our Mini and Mighty Oaks children have enjoyed their workshops with Chester Zoo and all children are eagerly anticipating our whole school trip to the Zoo next week. Our Seedling and Little Acorn children have continued to enjoy their Intensive Interaction sessions and are developing key Speech and Language skills with their motivational resources each and every day.

Whilst I say Goodbye to you all at Upton Westlea, I would like to say a huge 'Thank you' to all the wonderful children, staff and families here for having me as a Teacher for the last 9 years.
